



Title I Career & Training Services



The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) consists of five core partner programs: Titles I—IV, and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). These partners provide services through the American Job Center network in order to develop a quality workforce system to meet the needs of area employers and job seekers.

Temporary Assistance Title IV Vocational for Needy Families

In TANF District 7, the average wage for closed cases is \$9.41. 87% of cases with an achieved educational goal had a job in their field of study within 3 months, down due partly to several participants choosing to continue higher education degrees.

Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation served 637 customers in Northwest Tennessee. including 99 new enrollments since the beginning of the program year. 50 were closed in successful employment.

Special Projects

Recruitment for the Registered Electrical Apprenticeship Preparation (REAP) has begun with 7 high school "showcase" events scheduled through April. After the "showcase" presentation and hands-on demonstrations by the employer partner Amteck, interested high school seniors are invited to a "Shock & Awe Day" where they will experience a typical day in the life of an electrician. Up to 30 students will be selected for the 2-week Amteck University Pre-Apprenticeship program. Upon successful completion, graduates will be eligible for hire by Amteck and may be accepted into the 4- year Registered Apprenticeship to become Journeyman/ Licensed Electrician earning an estimated \$70,000 annually.
